This day Dr. R. A. Atkins personally appeared before me J. H. Landry Clerk of the County Court of Frypan County and made oath in due form of Law. That he is a regular practicing Physician in said County: That he has carefully examined Ephraim Rowland who served in the Late Confederate Army in Co. "C" 4<sup>th</sup> Va. Regt. Infantry and finds the said Ephraim Rowland is permanently disabled from manual labor by reason of a wound received from gunshot in his right arm.

That the said Ephraim Rowland is disabled in such manner, from said wound so received in <sup>service</sup> as to prevent the use of his arm in manual labor - Given under my hand this 24<sup>th</sup> day of ~~January~~ <sup>March</sup> 1879.

Virginia: Grayson County - territory:

This day Ephraim Bonham personally appeared before me J. Lundy Clerk of County Court for Grayson County, and made oath in due form of Law, that he is a citizen of the State of Virginia, and that he was permanently disabled by a wound received in his ~~left~~ arm in the late war, and was at the time he was disabled a citizen of the State of Virginia, and that he has not received an artificial limb from the State of Virginia, or any other State, or the United States, or under the provisions of any Act entitled an Act to provide artificial limbs for citizens of this Commonwealth who lost their limbs in the late war, passed January 29<sup>th</sup> 1867, or under the Act approved November 1<sup>st</sup> 1870 or under the Act approved March 26<sup>th</sup> 1872: that he has never received compensation under any of the Acts heretofore passed for that purpose. That he is disabled by said wound in such manner as to prevent the use of said ~~limb~~ in manual labor though his ~~arm~~ was not amputated.
