last will & Testament in manners following as touching such issues  
& estate wherewith it has pleased God to Bless me in this life I give  
and bequeath devise & dispose of the Same in the following manners  
and form,

First it is my will that all my Just Debts shall be paid out of my  
estate and the Remainder of my estate now in my possession  
whatsoever can be well spared it is my will there shall be a piece  
of land bought and that my wife Elizabeth shall have the full  
privilege thereto during her natural life as long as she continues in her  
widowhood and to have the children who are under age with her untill  
they arrive to each their full age together with all remaining movables  
and then if so be my wife should die before all the children come to age  
then the said children shall be sufficiently brought up out of said state  
at the discretion of my Executors and none of them to be bound out without  
their own Consent and after the decease of my wife if any land be  
bought and all movable estate left shall be equally divided among  
my children together which some of them had already got all which  
shall be valued so that each shall have an equal share the  
names of such my children are as follows Jacob Elizabeth Barbara  
Magdelon Lewis Christian John Henry Catherine Christena  
Abraham and if any of said children should die without Bodily  
hind then each of the remaining shall share equally all the same  
that is of such being left or belonging to such at their decease  
and the said my sons Jacob and Lewis whom I likewise constitute  
make and ordain the Sole Executors of this my last will and Testament, and  
I do hereby utterly disallow and Revoke all former testaments wills legacies  
and Executors Ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my last will  
& Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal  
this twenty fifth day of february in the year of our lord one thousand  
Seven hundred and ninety



 Jacob Blesing, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all  
 and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Decedent  
 which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of  
 the said Jacob & Lewis Blesing, or into the hands or possession of any  
 other person or persons for them, and the same so ~~truly~~ ~~and~~ ~~correctly~~  
~~bring~~ into the County Court of Shannandoah, at such time as they  
 shall see there required by the said Court under the same Goods Chattels  
 & Credits, do will and truly administer according to Law: and make  
 a just and true account of all their acting and doing therein  
 when thereunto required by the said Court; and further do will  
 and <sup>truly</sup> pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified  
 in the said Will as far as the said Goods Chattels & Credits will  
 extend according to the value thereof, and as the Law shall charge  
 them this Obligation to be void & otherwise in full force
