I Jesse Caudill Sr. of Pulcher County, State of Kentucky, being in good health and sound mind, do by these presents make this my last will and testament and for the purpose hereinafter mentioned viz:

1st I will my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the grave.

2nd I will that Nancy Caudill and Sallie Bradhears my daughters and Rachel Boggs my daughter child have Fifty dollars each and that the two heirs of Ester Brown have twenty five dollars each they being my ~~children~~ children to be paid as soon as practicable after my death out of my estate.

3rd I will to my sons James Caudill Nothie Caudill Benjamin Caudill John M Caudill and heirs of Henry Caudill (deceased) and my daughter Susan Roberts, One dollar each to be paid after my death out of my estate (They all having heretofore received Fifty dollars each from my estate as their part)

4th I will that one half of my landed estate be retained and go after my death to the party or parties who clothe feed and care for me during the remainder of my natural life.
