IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, James P. Hash, being of sound mind, but feeble of body, do make this my last will and testament.

1. I desire and will that all of my just debts and funeral and burial expenses be paid, as soon as may be, after my decease, out of my property or any moneys or money that may be or had at time of my decease; and to be included in said indebtedness and paid, are any and all notes given by me to my son, H. B. Hash, altho the same might be barred by the Statute of Limitations.
2.
