In the name of god amen the 23rd day of June in the year
of our lord 1813 I Joseph Bonham of Wythe County and
State of Virginia, being sick and weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory thank be given to god, those
for calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
and ordain, this my last will and Testament, that is to
say principally and first of all I give and Recommend
my soul into the hands of god that gave it to me for my
body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a christian
like and decent manner at the discretion of my Execu-
tors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same by the mighty power of god and as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased
god to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose
of the same in the following manner and form

Item It is my will and I do order that in the first place
that all my Just debts and funeral Charges be paid and
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Naomi
the land whereon I now live containing seventy acres to be
for her support as long as she lives, or remain single, but if
she marries to belong to the person her I give to
my son Herychias Bonham the above mentioned
tract of land containing seventy acres which I have
William Bonham's obligation for which I do order
that the sd Wm Bonham do make to the above
Herychias Bonham a good and agreeable agree-
to the before named obligation, Item I give and allow
to my two single daughters each one her and one

Cow and six sheep one spinning wheel and a chest I give
I give I give to my two grand daughters Nancy and Sarah
Ball if they stay till of age each one bed and one cow and
six sheep one spinning wheel and a chest I give
to William Bonham Esq. Howell Gierby David Packer
Whise Betsy woods and Ephraim Bonham each the sum
of one dollar I give and allow all the rest of my
goods chattels and moveable property to my wife Naomi
as long as she lives single and she is to have no power to
dispose of any of sd property If she marries for it is my
will and desire that it shall be equally divided among all
my children I do appoint and allow my well beloved
wife Naomi to be my sole executor of this my last will
and Testament and do hereby ~~fully~~ disallow revoke and
disannul all and every other Testament, Will, legacy and
executor by me in any wise before married willed and
bequeathed Ratifying this my last will and Testament in
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal


