I, Joseph Staley of the County of Wythe and state of Virginia being afflicted in body but of sound disposing mind memory and understanding considering the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and that I may be the better prepared when it shall come do make this my last will and testament on this 12th day of January 1866 in manner and form to wit, First, it is my Will that my beloved Wife Christenny Staley shall have one third of all my estate both real and personal and one third of all the grain made in the Will second it is my will that whereas I have deeded my lands to my two sons Isaac & David Staley but reserved the use thereof so long as I shall live and after my death the one to pay to my son Jacob Staley eight hundred Dollars to be equally divided between my son Jacob and seven Daughters the first payment of Fifty Dollars of each to be made twelve months after my death which hundred Dollars Jacob Staley is to have for his first payment on

The Eight hundred dollars, mis to him and to pay annually the sum of Fifty dollars each until the whole sum is paid whereas I have paid to my daughter Catharine five hundred Dollars in my life time none of the rest of my daughters should not receive that amount she shall refund so as to make them equal Whereas I have paid to my daughter Mary Muser the sum of two hundred Dollars Sophia the sum of two hundred dol Sally Huddle the sum of one hundred & fifty Dollars and Harriet Dutton two hundred Dollars. It is my Will that the rest of my daughters Hannah and Emaline be made equal before those above shall have any thing it is my Will that my daughter Emaline have my Bureau. It is my Will that all my daughters that have staid or may stay single shall have fifteen Dollars a year for all the time she staid after she were twenty one year old. It is my Will that my son Jacob shall have my Gray Horse or any or that he may wish. It is my Will as my son Jacob is unable to attend to his own business. I now appoint Leonard Huddle as his guardian so long as he will live or be able to attend to it and then his son John Huddle to take his place. Lastly I hereby nominate constitute and appoint W. S. Steffen & David Staley Executor of this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all others & former Will made by me ratifying this to be my last Will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal
