 Virginia, being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given
 unto Gods Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say
 principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God
 that gave it and my body recommends to the earth to be buried in decent Christian
 Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general
 resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as
 touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life
 I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner & form that
 is after all my debts dues and demands is paid.

First to sell as much property as is thought can be spared the best & pay my debts
 & purchase a Negro Cart and if there is any money left to let my beloved sons or
 daughters have it which stands in the most need by paying lawful interest.

Secondly I give & bequeath to Ruth my beloved wife my plantation to maintain
 her, her lifetime & my son Samuel to live with her & work the place & have the
 use of every thing while he takes good care of his mother & they can agree to live
 together & likewise she is to have the negro Cart her lifetime & if they cant
 agree to live together the Executors is to see & put some person on the place that
 she may not come to want.

Thirdly I give unto my beloved Daughters Mary & Margaret two beds each &
 bed clothing and furniture & dresser furniture & make their home with their
 mother likewise two cows each. moreover at my wifes death to make an equal
 divide among all my Children. Likewise my son Samuel to have a brown
 two year old filley and saddle & Bridle. Likewise I give unto Mary & Margaret
 one saddle each.

Likewise I make constitute & ordain the sole Executrice of this my last Will
 & Testament Ruth Bishop my beloved wife and my Loving Sons Noah Bishop
 & Levi Bishop and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke disannul all & every
 other former Testament, Will, bargain, bequests and Executors by me in any wise
 before named Willed & bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other

hand Year this the tenth day of June one thousand eight hundred & eighteen.

 & Levi Bishop the Executors therein named who took the oaths of an executor
 prescribed by law & entered into and acknowledged their bonds in the sum of Four
 Thousand dollars with James Cole, Robert Colleton, Benjamin Roe, Samuel
 Seeper, Aaron Fairchild and Peleg Bishop their securities conditioned as the
 law directs. A Certificate is therefore granted them for the probat of the said
 Will in due form.

property.

I give to my wife Margaret one third part of the tract of land whereon
Snow live during her widowhood; being the same tract hereafter bequeath
& reserved to my son Robert Buchanan. I also give to my wife
Margaret my negro boy named Jacob during her widowhood, & also my
negro girl named Margaret Jane during her natural life, and at
her death Jacob and Margaret Jane & their issue if any, to be equally
divided amongst my children; but if she should marry, at the
marriage Jacob is to be equally divided amongst my children. I
further give to my wife Margaret her choice of my horses, her saddle
& bridle, three milch cows, ten sheep two beds & necessary furniture
all my household cupboard & kitchen furniture. and should my
wife marry, then the above mentioned household, cupboard and
kitchen furniture is to be equally divided amongst my three
daughters. I further direct that my wife have possession of my dwelling
house so long as she remains my widow & no longer.

I give to my son Robert Buchanan the tract of land whereon
Snow live, with all its appurtenances to him this heirs forever. except
that part which lies north of a line to be run from the dogwood and
