their mother Mary Elizabeth Hagg in her last illness on the day before  
her death called the witnesses to her bed told them that she gave her  
daughter Hannah thirty pounds for taking care of her also that she gave  
her grand daughter Elizabeth Hagg daughter of Michael Hagg the price  
of one bed & spinning wheel - and the balance of her estate she desired  
might be equally divided among her children, and she also desired that  
Joseph Hagg might settle her estate - The decedent requested the  
witnesses to take notice that the above was her Will - That the said  
Mary Elizabeth Hagg died on the day of this month - And it is  
Ordered that the same be established as the Nuncupative Will of  
the said Mary E Hagg dec<sup>d</sup> - And on the motion of Joseph Hagg  
who took the oath of an administrator with the Will annexed entered

hundred dollars with John Galligher and Alexander Eakin his

I John Gross of Washington County & Commonwealth of Virginia being at present though weak in body yet of perfect mind & memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of this life & that it is appointed for all men once to die & after death to come to judgment do make & ordain this as my last Will & Testament in the manner following to wit, first I principally recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it & my body to the earth from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as for such things as God hath blessed me with in this life I leave & bequeath as follows.

Imprimis - I will that all my just debts & funeral charges be fully paid & satisfied.

I item - I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Barbara one half fully exclusive of one third of all my goods & chattels.

I item - I give & bequeath to my son Isaac Gross one Chickysa more one year old exclusive of all my personal estate. - And the remainder of my personal estate I allow to be sold & the money put to interest till my children comes of age after what is sufficient to school my children well and as for my land I would allow it not to be sold but rented to my children comes of age. When my children comes of age I allow my lands to be sold and the price thereof to be equally divided amongst my children which are nine in number Elizabeth, Isaac, Lucretia Jacob, Edmond, Sarah, Mary, John and Margaret likewise allow my personal estate to be equally divided amongst them and they are to receive that as they come of age and if one or more of my children should die before they come of age leaving no lawful heir or issue of their body then the surviving parties to have their parts or parts equally divided amongst them.

And Lastly I do make & ordain Captain Joseph Cole, Nehemiah Williams and John Houston Executors to this my last Will & Testament revoking & making void all and former other Wills & Testaments heretofore by me made Rectifying & Confirming this this only as my last Will & Testament this twenty fifth day of September one thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine
