The following Will of William Hampton Esq. was this day produced to Court & proven and ordered to be entered to probate.

The Common Wealth of Kentucky, Letcher County,

I William Hampton being of Sound Mind & not being under any legal disability do hereby make this my last Will & testament, my Will is that all my just debts be paid out of my personal Estate & so much there be iff not out of my Real Estate then my Will is, that Phoebe Hampton my Wife have my houses and crocks and two hundred acres of Land including the same and all personal furniture so long as she lives my Will is that John S Hampton have the farm that he lives upon in Commerce to commence at a poplar tree at the East end of the Spring field including all the Land up and branch to the mouth of the Long Fork hollow my Will is that Solomon M Hampton my Son have that farm that he lives on now to commence at the mouth of the Spring branch including all the Land on the right hand side of the branch up to John S Hampton's Line my Will is that Stephen C Hampton my Son have the fifty acres of Land that I own on the head of Stephen Adams branch and that John S Hampton and Solomon M Hampton pay Stephen C Hampton twelve dollars and fifty cents Cash in property to make them equal with them in Land my Will is that William Hampton and James S Hampton my Sons have all that Land owned by me from Solomon M Hampton & John S Hampton's Lines now and hereafter to Samuel Corbills Line at the mouth of their mother my Will is that Mary Corbills Polly Brashers Rachel Corbills & Luana Hampton my daughters have all the Land owned by me from John S Hampton Line up said branch to be equally divided between them my Will is that all my debts now ten Dollars Cash to be paid out of my personal only Rachel Corbills and his only seven dollars and fifty cents my Will is that William Hampton my Son have all my blacksmith tools my Will is that after the above will is satisfied that Phoebe Hampton have the balance of my personal Estate also that Solomon Hampton my Executor to collect all my debts and pay them to Phoebe Hampton my Wife and that she use the same to his lawful Sign by me this the 6th day of April 1874
